SUB-FUND SUITABILITY

WHO IS THE SUB-FUND SUITABLE FOR?

-The ILP Sub-Fund is only suitable for investors seeking to invest in companies based in, or closely associated with the Asia Pacific region (ex-Japan). The Fund will invest in companies offering the potential for regular income as well seeking capital growth over the long term.

-It is important to remember that, as with most investments, the value of your investments are not guaranteed and can go down as well as up. Therefore we suggest that you only invest money that can be committed for the medium to long term. You should also bear in mind that securities held within a Fund may not be denominated in the currency of that Fund, so unit prices may fall purely on account of exchange rate fluctuations.

-Please note that Friends Provident International Limited ("FPIL") investment products are intended for medium to long term investment and are not therefore designed for early surrender. If you do surrender early, a product surrender charge may be applied. Please note that the earlier you terminate your plan, the more you may lose.

KEY FEATURES OF THE SUB-FUND

WHAT ARE YOU INVESTING IN?

-You are investing in an ILP Sub-Fund that invests in the FSSA Asian Equity Plus Fund* ("the Fund" or "underlying Fund"), apart from a proportionately small amount which may be held in cash to optimise dealing efficiencies in the underlying fund. We endeavour to maintain a cash balance limit of up to 0.75%.

-The underlying fund of the ILP Sub-Fund is an accumulation fund, which means the fund will automatically reinvest any dividends

*The Fund is a Sub-Fund of First Sentier Investors Global Umbrella Fund Plc, which is an Open-Ended Investment Company incorporated in Ireland and its home regulator is the Central Bank of Ireland.

<p>-The investment objective of the Fund is to achieve long term capital appreciation.</p> <p>-The Fund invests primarily (at least 70% of its Net Asset Value) in equity securities or equity-related securities of companies that are listed, or have their registered offices in, or conduct a majority of their economic activity in the Asia Pacific region (excluding Japan).</p> <p>-The Investment Manager will select investments which it believes offer the potential for dividend growth and price appreciation.</p> <p>-The Fund is not subject to any limitation on the portion of its Net Asset Value that may be invested in any one or more Emerging Markets in the Asia Pacific region (excluding Japan), any sector or any limitation on the market capitalisation of the companies in which it may invest.</p> <p>-The Fund's maximum exposure to China A-Shares (including those listed on the Stock Connects for example, and/or indirectly through equity linked or participation notes and collective investment schemes) will not exceed 50% of the Fund's Net Asset Value.</p> <p>-The Fund's maximum exposure to China B-Shares (through direct investment) will not exceed 10% of the Fund's Net Asset Value.</p> <p>-The Fund may only use Financial Derivative Instruments for purposes of hedging and Efficient Portfolio Management. HOW CAN YOU EXIT FROM THIS INVESTMENT AND WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND COSTS IN DOING SO?

-There is a cooling off period of 30 days from when you receive your Policy Documents. If you decide to exit the policy during this time you should complete the Cancellation Form (enclosed with your Policy Documents) and send this back to the address provided, together with the original Policy Documents. We will refund any monies paid, less any shortfall (if any) as a result of the value of your investment falling by the time you tell us of your wish to cancel. If you elect to exit your policy after the cooling off period has expired, penalties may be applied.

-If you no longer wish to invest in this FPIL ILP Sub-Fund you have selected, you may switch all or part of your holdings into an alternative Fund(s) by sending us a completed Switch/Redirection Request form, signed. Switching from one Fund to another is done on a bid to bid basis, without charge (although we do reserve the right to charge). If you are switching between currencies, the relevant exchange rates will be applied and shown on your switch confirmation.

The sale proceeds that you will receive will be the realisation price multiplied by the number of units sold, less any charges. An example (assuming a redemption charge of 4%) is as follows *:

APPENDIX : GLOSSARY OF TERMS

China A-Shares

Shares issued by companies listed on the Shanghai or Shenzhen stock exchange and denominated in RMB.

China B-Shares

Shares issued by companies listed on the Shanghai or Shenzhen stock exchange and denominated in USD or HKD.

Efficient Portfolio Management (EPM)

EPM is a set of standards for prudent management of investment Funds. The standards call for economically appropriate transactions that reduce risk, reduce cost or generate additional capital or income. For example, a

currency overlay strategy using derivative instruments could be used to reduce volatility in asset returns resulting from currency fluctuations or be used to take advantage of these fluctuations to gain extra return.

Expense Ratio

The Expense Ratio provides customers with an indication of the overall costs of investing in a particular Fund. The Expense Ratio as calculated in accordance with the Investment Management Association of Singapore's guidelines on the disclosure of Expense Ratios. Different methods of calculation of Expense Ratio can be used, including Total Expense Ratio (TER) and Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF) but these are broadly the same.

Financial Derivative Instruments (FDI)

Also known as derivatives, they are financial contracts, the value of which is tied to an underlying asset. Examples include futures, options and warrants.

Hedge/ Hedging

Any transaction with the objective of limiting exposure to risk such as changes in exchange rates or prices.

Net Asset Value (NAV)

Net Asset Value is the value of the net assets of the Fund after deduction of all expenses.

Open-Ended Investment Company

An open-ended collective investment vehicle, structured as an investment company, where new shares are created or redeemed, depending on demand from investors.

Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF)

A type of Expense Ratio. The Ongoing Charges Figure is based on expenses for the previous year and is a ratio of the total ongoing charges and the Fund's average Net Asset Value over its last reporting period. This figure may vary from year to year. The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of the underlying ILP Sub-Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

Renminbi (RMB)

This is the currency of the Peoples Republic of China. Renminbi is not a freely convertible currency and is subject to foreign exchange control policies of and repatriation restrictions imposed by the Chinese government.

Specified Investment Product (SIP)

SIP is a class of investment products defined by the Monetary Authority of Singapore (MAS). Generally, (although not in all instances), financial advisers have to carry out more due diligence, including customer knowledge assessments, when advising about a SIP.

Stock Connect

The mutual market access programme through which investors such as Funds can deal in permitted securities listed on the Shanghai Stock Exchange (SSE) and the Shenzhen Stock Exchange (SZSE) through the Hong Kong Stock Exchange (SEHK) and clearing house in Hong Kong (Northbound Trading). Chinese domestic investors can deal in select securities listed on the SEHK through the SSE or the SZSE or other Stock Exchanges in the future as permitted by the regulators and their respective clearing house.

Umbrella Fund

An investment company which has a group of Sub-Funds (pools) each having its own investment portfolio. The purpose of this structure is to provide investment flexibility and widen investor choice.

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
