KEY FEATURES OF THE SUB-FUND

WHAT ARE YOU INVESTING IN?

- -You are investing in an ILP Sub-Fund that invests in the Janus Henderson Horizon China Opportunities Fund* ("the Fund" or "underlying fund"), apart from a proportionately small amount which may be held in cash to optimise dealing efficiencies in the underlying fund. We endeavour to maintain a cash balance limit of up to 0.75%.
- -The underlying fund of the ILP Sub-Fund is an accumulation fund, which means the fund will automatically reinvest any dividends.
- *The underlying Fund is a Sub-Fund of the Janus Henderson Horizon Fund. Janus Henderson Horizon Fund is an Open-Ended Investment Company incorporated in Luxembourg and its home regulator is the Commission de Surveillance du Secteur Financier (CSSF).

- -The Fund will invest at least 80% of its net assets in equities or equity-related Instruments of; (i) companies having their registered office in China and Hong Kong; (ii) companies that do not have their registered office in China and Hong Kong but do most of their business, either directly or through subsidiaries, in China and Hong Kong.
- -Equities may include China A-Shares, directly through the Stock Connect Programs and other eligible exchanges or indirectly through derivative instruments. Exposure to China A-Shares will not be more than 50% of the Fund's Net Asset Value.

KEY RISKS

WHAT ARE THE KEY RISKS OF THIS INVESTMENT?

- -The value of an investment is not guaranteed and can go up and down depending on performance. You could get back less than you have paid in. At times, the ILP Sub-Fund may (Subject to the Appointed Actuary's agreement and provisions allowed for in the Policy Conditions) need to change the way its price is calculated, to ensure that those moving in and out of the ILP Sub-Fund are fairly treated. This can have a negative effect on the ILP Sub-Fund's price and performance.

Market and Credit Risks

Foreign Exchange risk: The underlying assets of the Fund may be denominated in currencies other than the currency of the share class you have invested into. The value of your investment may rise or fall in line with movements in the relevant exchange rates.

Liquidity Risks

Liquidity risk: The Fund may be adversely affected by a decrease in market liquidity for the securities in which it invests which may impair the Fund's ability to execute transactions. In such circumstances, some of the Fund's securities may become illiquid which may mean the Fund may experience difficulties in selling securities at a fair price within a timely manner.

Product-Specific Risks

Chinese Market risk: Investing in Emerging Markets such as the PRC subjects the Fund to a higher level of market risk than investments in a developed country. This is due to, among other things, greater market volatility, lower trading volume, political and economic instability, settlement risk, greater risk of market shut down and more governmental limitations on foreign investment than those typically found in developed markets.

Stock Connect risk: Investments through the Stock Connect are subject to additional risks, namely, quota limitations, suspension risk, operational risk, restrictions on selling imposed by front-end monitoring, recalling of eligible stocks, clearing and settlement risks and regulatory risk.

APPENDIX: GLOSSARY OF TERMS

China A-Shares

Shares issued by companies listed on the Shanghai or Shenzhen stock exchange and denominated in RMB.

Equity

Ownership positions in companies that can be traded in public markets. Often produce current income which may be paid in the form of dividends. In the event of the company going bankrupt Equity holders' claims are subordinate to the claims of preferred stockholders and bondholders.

Expense Ratio

The Expense Ratio provides customers with an indication of the overall costs of investing in a particular Fund.

The Expense Ratio as calculated in accordance with the Investment Management Association of Singapore's guidelines on the disclosure of Expense Ratios. Different methods of calculation of Expense Ratio can be used, including Total Expense Ratio (TER) and Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF) but these are broadly the same.

Financial Derivative Instruments (FDI)

Also known as derivatives, they are financial contracts, the value of which is tied to an underlying asset. Examples of derivatives include futures, options and warrants.

Leverage

The use of financial instruments to increase the potential return of an investment.

Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF)

A type of Expense Ratio. The Ongoing Charges Figure is based on expenses for the previous year and is a ratio of the total ongoing charges and the Fund's average Net Asset Value over its last reporting period. This figure may vary from year to year. The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of the underlying fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

Securities Lending

The act of loaning a stock, derivative, other security to an investor or firm. Securities Lending requires the borrower to put up collateral, whether cash, security or a letter of credit. When a security is loaned, the title and the ownership is also transferred to the borrower.

Stock Connect

The mutual market access programme, through which investors such as Funds can deal in permitted securities listed on the Shanghai Stock Exchange (SSE), Shenzhen Stock Exchange (SZSE), Hong Kong Stock Exchange (SEHK) and clearing house in Hong Kong (Northbound Trading). Chinese domestic investors can deal in selected securities listed on the SEHK through the SSE or the SZSE or other Stock Exchanges in the future as permitted by the regulators and their respective clearing house.

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
